Membership and Privileges

### **Background:**

The Board of Managers of University Health System has approval authority for the appointment of clinical providers to the Medical-Dental Staff and the granting of clinical privileges for overseeing the quality of care and provision of treatment to patients. University Health System's Professional Staff Services department (PSS) is responsible for ensuring compliance regarding all applicants for the credentialing and privileging of providers. Operating under the strict standards, Professional Staff Services handles the Health System's credentialing and privileging process from beginning to end as outlined below.

# **Credentialing Process:**

Requests for the credentialing and privileging of clinical providers are collected and reviewed by UHS Medical-Dental Staff Coordinators who ensure that all necessary information is included in the application. A properly completed application is then sent to the Central Verifications Office (CVO) staff, within the UHS Professional Staff Services department, to perform primary source verifications of all professional activities from graduation of medical school to the present.

Once the CVO staff has completed the primary source verifications, the UHS PSS staff assembles a complete file to be reviewed by the appropriate clinical Department Chair at the UT Health School of Medicine. Once approved by the Department Chair, the complete file is presented to the appropriate Medical-Dental Staff Committee – either the UHS Allied Health or UHS Physician Credentials Committee for review and approval.

Upon approval, Professional Staff Services for UHS will request temporary privileges for the provider. Approval from the following are required in order to grant the Pendency of Application for Temporary Privileges: Chief of Medical-Dental Staff; the Director of UHS Professional Staff Services department; the VP of Legal Services; President/CEO of

the Health System or designee (Chief Medical Officer); and the Executive Committee of the Medical-Dental Staff. The UHS Board of Managers has final approval of all applicant files.

If final approval is received from the Board of Managers, the provider is placed on a twoyear reappointment cycle. After 12 months' provisional review, the provider's status changes from Provisional to Active or Courtesy Staff depending on board certification and the frequency of patient encounters during the previous 12 months.

Pursuant to Article III, Section 3.3-1 of the Medical-Dental Staff Bylaws, initial appointments and reappointments to the Staff shall be made by the Board of Managers. The Board of Managers shall act on initial appointments, reappointments, or revocation of appointments only after there has been a recommendation from the Executive Committee.

The Credentials Committee met on December 14, 2020 and reviewed the credential files of the individuals listed on the attached Credentials Report and the Professional Performance Evaluation Report. In its meeting of January 5, 2021, the Executive Committee of the Medical-Dental Staff recommended approval of the following:

## **Background:**

The Board of Managers of University Health System has approval authority for the appointment of clinical providers to the Medical-Dental Staff and the granting of clinical privileges for overseeing the quality of care and provision of treatment to patients. University Health System's Professional Staff Services department (PSS) is responsible for ensuring compliance regarding all applicants for the credentialing and privileging of providers. Operating under the strict standards, Professional Staff Services handles the Health System's credentialing and privileging process from beginning to end and then monitors progress between appointment cycles.

# **Credentialing Processes:**

As part of continuous quality improvement, and in alignment with Joint Commission standards, the Health System Professional Staff Services Office monitors the clinical privileges of all privileged providers through the Professional Practice Evaluation process. Professional Practice Evaluation is a process whereby Medical-Dental staff member(s) are evaluated in regards to his/her competency and professional performance. New privileges, results of Peer Review, and assessment of Supervision are all examples of Professional Practice Evaluation.

Also in alignment with Joint Commission standards, the Professional Staff Services Office maintains Delineation of Privileges (DOP) for the Medical-Dental Staff. The Delineation of Privileges is a process in which the organized Medical-Dental staff evaluates and recommends an individual practitioner be allowed to provide specific patient care services with well-defined training criteria.

The Credentials Committee met on December 14, 2020 and reviewed proposed revisions to Delineation of Privilege and the Professional Performance Evaluation

### **Background:**

University Health currently leases 40,544 sq. ft. of office space at Wonderland of the Americas located on Fredericksburg Road. This space was originally designated for classroom training and competency testing clinical and non-clinical staff and providers as University Health and UT Health San Antonio under took the adoption of the new electronic health record, Epic.

With the implementation of Epic last year, this space is no longer necessary for classroom training. However, this location can now be used for the distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine. It will also be used for COVID-19 screening as a preadmission procedure for University Hospital patients prior to their elective surgery or procedure.

### **Analysis:**

Wonderland of the Americas (a.k.a. – Crossroads Mall) is located on Fredericksburg Road adjacent to the IH-10 and Loop 410 interchange. It is very accessible and in close proximity to University Hospital. It provides a convenient and well known location for the general public. Accordingly, staff has determined to use this site for distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine to eligible Bexar County citizens. In addition, as a pre-admission procedure for asymptomatic patients of UH, COVID-19 screening will be performed here prior to their admittance to the hospital. Previously, this pre-procedure testing was done at the Express Med Pavilion.

## **Fiscal Impact:**

The original one year lease term for this location commenced December 1, 2019, at a rental rate of \$20.00 per sq. ft. (\$67,573.33 per month). The lease was amended effective October 1, 2020 with an adjusted rental rate of \$7.75 per sq. ft. (\$26,191.00 per month). With previously Board approved funding, the lease will terminate February 28, 2021.

The proposed renewal term will extend the lease agreement to September 30, 2023. The amended monthly rental amount of \$26,191.00 will stay in effect for a total lease expense of \$811,921.

The lease rate includes maintenance, insurance, chilled water for HVAC, and janitorial service. There is a thirty (30) day termination clause in the lease agreement provided for both the Landlord and Tenant. This lease expense will be funded through 2021 operational funds.

This lease amendment is in line with the Health System's Triple Aim Plus goals and objectives. This lease agreement will allow valuable space to be efficiently utilized at a reduced monthly fee.

## **Quality:**

This location with its close proximity to the hospital campus, convenient access, and ample parking will serve patients and the general public in an efficient and timely manner. In addition, the Landlord has been extremely cooperative in accomodating UH in this vaccine distribution process, thereby greatly assisting the general public in this complicated process.

## **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends Board of Managers' approval of the amendment to the lease contract with Crossroads Mall Partners, Ltd. thereby extending the lease term to September 30, 2023 in an amount not to exceed \$811,921.

### Consideration of Report on Investments for the Fourth Quarter 2020

Attached for your approval are the Investment Portfolio Summaries for University Health and Community First Health Plans (CFHP) invested funds for the fourth quarter of 2020. In total, the value of all invested funds as of December 31, 2020, was \$1,643,039,457 consisting of University Health, Project, Certificate and CFHP Funds. The reports include all information required by the Texas Public Funds Investment Act. In addition, University Health and CFHP portfolio reports have been provided separately. The portfolios earned \$2,180,384 in interest income during the fourth quarter, a 66% decline from \$6,469,452 in the same period a year ago, reflecting the collapse in interest rates during 2020. The portfolio's unrealized gain moderated to \$4,576,861.

As of December 31, 2020, University Health portfolio for operations (excluding CFHP and the debt related funds) was valued at \$1,030,441,389. The portfolio, consisting of the Operating, Contingency, Capital and Tax Funds, had a weighted average yield-to-maturity of 0.54% and a weighted average maturity of 253 days. The portfolio's yield pulled well ahead of its benchmarks this quarter, easily topping both the 6-month Constant Maturity Treasury (CMT) benchmark, which yielded 0.12%, and the 1-year CMT benchmark's 0.38% yield.

In April of 2018, University Health received bond proceeds of \$308,000,000 from the issuance of the Certificates of Obligation Series 2018. As of December 31, 2020, the Project Fund was valued at \$182,254,537, had a weighted average yield-to-maturity of 0.77% and a weighted average maturity of 173 days. The Project Fund is held in assets meeting the PFIA requirements, with \$134,645,949 in money markets or maturing in less than 180 days to meet any liquidity needs. This portfolio's yield is substantially above both the 6-month CMT's 0.12% and the 1-year CMT's 0.38%.

In late-February of 2020, University Health received bond proceeds of \$170,000,000 from the issuance of the Certificates of Obligation Series 2020. As of December 31, 2020, this Project Fund was valued at \$170,452,059 had a weighted average yield-to-maturity of 0.19% and a weighted average maturity of 271 days. The timing of receipt of these funds coincided with significant market turmoil surrounding the coronavirus, which has impacted the investment strategy and results. This portfolio's yield was modestly above the 6-month CMT's 0.12%, but below the longer 1-year CMT's 0.38%.

University Health also collects property taxes for debt service which are segregated into the Certificate Fund. The amount held in this account as of December 31, 2020 was \$39,099,259 and had a weighted average yield-to-maturity of 0.01%. The Certificate Fund monies are held in a money market mutual fund in order to make a debt service payment on February 15, 2021.

University Health began operating a Local Provider Participation Fund (LPPF) which is financed by mandatory payments assessed on private hospitals. As of December 31, 2020, the balance in this account is \$6,397,874. The funds are held in a money market mutual fund in order to process intergovernmental transfers when required. The weighted average yield to maturity for these funds is 0.01%.

The CFHP portfolio (including the Community First Group Hospital Service Corporation PPO) was valued at \$214,394,339 as of December 31, 2020. The CFHP portfolio had a weighted average yield-to-maturity of 0.21% and a weighted average maturity of 214 days. The portfolio's yield fell between the 6-month and 1-year CMT benchmarks, which yielded 0.12% and 0.38% respectively. The portfolio's yield is hampered by CFHP's liquidity requirements. In addition, like University Health, the timing of receipts in late December resulted in higher balances held in money market mutual funds.

The fourth quarter story was multifaceted, with a global resurgence of the coronavirus, FDA approval of two extremely effective vaccines, a presidential election resulting in a new administration, and signs of a slowdown in economic growth. During the quarter, Covid-19 hospitalizations quadrupled and the total number of Covid-related deaths jumped by 70%. 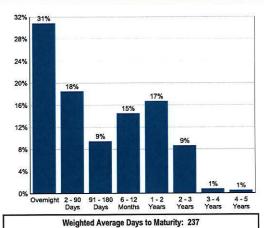


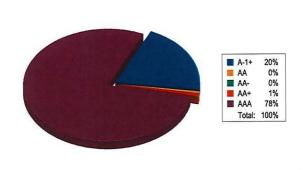
### Allocation by Issuer

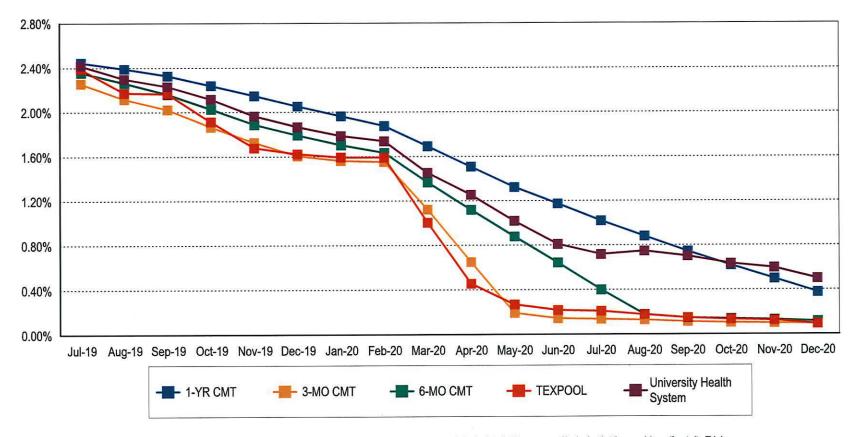

#### **MARKET RECAP - DECEMBER 2020:**

The fourth quarter story was multifaceted, with a global resurgence of the virus, FDA approval of two extremely effective vaccines, a contested election that will presumably result in a Biden presidency, and signs of a slowdown in economic growth. During the quarter, Covid-19 hospitalizations quadrupled and the total number of Covid deaths jumped by 70%. Because the broad economy remained open for the most part during the holidays, experts are bracing for another rise in cases in January.

Economic data released during December confirmed prior signals that the economic recovery was slipping. The ISM manufacturing index fell from 59.3 to a still solid 56.7, but the employment index was more concerning as it fell from 53.2 into contraction territory at 48.4. November's employment report confirmed that signal and was clear in its depiction of moderating job growth with nonfarm payrolls increasing just 245k, well below the 460k median forecast. Payrolls are still down more than 10 million from the pre-pandemic period early in the year. The sidelined workers primarily represent the service sector, with restaurants, bars, gyms, conferences and sporting events still far from normal. The unemployment rate dropped from 6.9% to 6.7% last month, although this improvement is a little deceptive as it was driven by a decline in the labor force participation rate which, at 61.5%, is now within one tenth of a 45-year low. First time filings for unemployment benefits spiked to a three-month high of 892k in mid-December and stubbornly remain nearly 4x pre-pandemic norms. Some 20 million Americans continue to receive unemployment benefits in combined state and federal programs. Consumer spending has slowed as well, with overall retail sales for November down -1.1% following a downwardly revised -0.1% October decline. Inflation remains on the backburner with overall CPI holding steady at +1.6% year-over-year, while core CPI runs at a +1.2% pace. The 2020 housing boom finally moderated with existing home sales slipping by -2.5% in November, breaking a five-month string of advances. However, the 6.7 million unit annualized sales pace was still +25.8% above the same period a year ago. New home sales dropped -11.0% in November but are still up more than +20% year-over-year.

It's important to note that the recovery thus far has been wildly uneven. Census data revealed in early December that nearly 83 million adults in the U.S. are finding it "somewhat" or "very difficult" to cover basic monthly expenses such as food, rent or mortgage, car payments, medical expenses, or student loans. This is in sharp contrast to the surge in overall wealth that has driven household net worth to a new record high. Congress did finally pass an aid package by the end of the year, offering another month of eviction protection, an extension of federal jobless benefits and a \$600 stimulus check for individuals, in addition to a replenishing of the Paycheck Protection Program.

The forward-looking stock markets focused on the vaccine rollout and the additional aid package rather than the rapid spread of the virus and the weakening economic numbers. Both the DOW and the S&P 500 closed the year at fresh record highs. First quarter GDP growth is likely to be relatively weak, but should improve in subsequent quarters as an increasing number of Americans are vaccinated and begin a return to pre-pandemic normality.

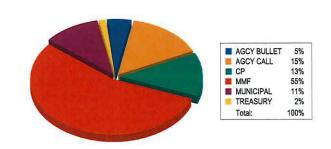

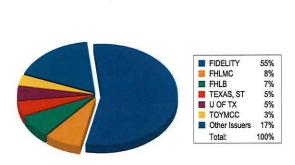

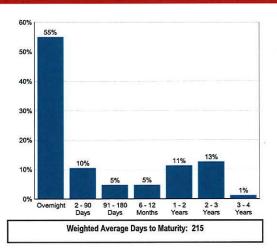


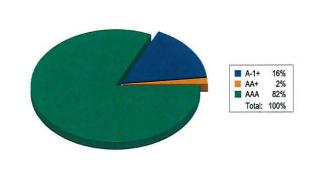
### Allocation by Issuer

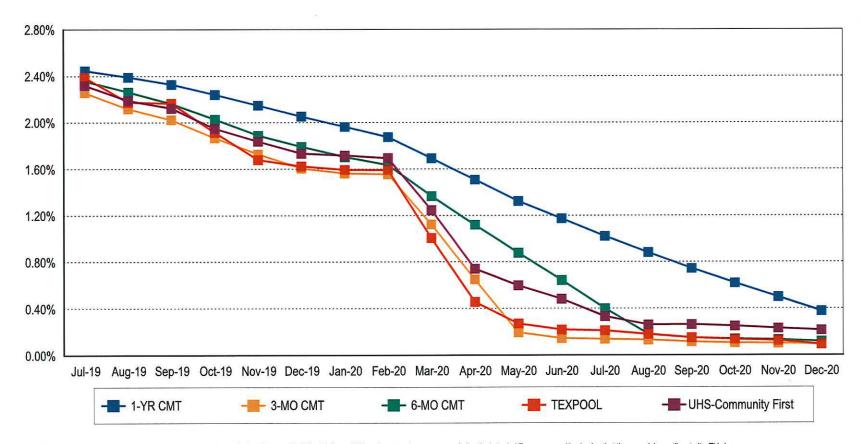

Consideration and Appropriate Action Regarding a Contract with Waste Management National Services, Inc., for Waste Stream Management Services

# **Background:**

Waste Management National Services, Inc. (Waste Management) has provided services to University Health since 2011. The original contract was awarded to Waste Management through Request for Proposal (RFP) 210-10-279-IF. There have been eleven subsequent amendments to the original contract. All renewal options have been exhausted and a new contract was solicited through RFP 220-09-051-SVC. Waste streams managed through this contract include: municipal, medical, pharmacy, hazardous, chemical, sharps, recycling and confidential document bins. Since the initial contract with Waste Management, waste stream volumes have increased by 63%. University Health is considered a large generator of waste by the State of Texas and thus is heavily regulated my multiple federal, state, and local entities. Other services provided by Waste Management include the completion and monitoring of manifests, safety/compliance audits, staff education and oversight of the biohazard autoclaves located at University Hospital. A master waste stream program allows University Health to designate a single accountable company to manage waste streams, maintain regulatory documents, standardize operational processes, and provide one point of contact for support.

# **Analysis:**

On October 22, 2020, only one respondent submittal was received by Procurement for RFP #220-09-051-SVC which was from Waste Management. After careful consideration and review, the recommendation of leadership was to award the master waste stream services contract to Waste Management. During the course of the previous 10 years, Waste Management has been an excellent partner with University Health. Waste Management has provided ongoing annual reviews for all University Health waste streams and provided operational expertise and technology to reduce

waste stream volumes and costs. During the term of the original agreement, there have been no regulatory findings.

# **Quality Note:**

Waste Management provides customers with a robust quality program by performing ongoing waste stream audits to identify service and cost improvement opportunities. The vendor mitigates risk to University Health by implementing best practices and providing expertise and guidance on state and federal regulations for each waste stream. In addition, the onsite manager provides continuous education and training to University Health staff on the proper handling and processing of waste streams to effectively initiate and maintain sustainable programs.

# **Fiscal Impact:**

The value of a new five-year contract with Waste Management is \$10,123,895. Associated costs are listed below:

In the above chart, flat fees represent the base costs to remove waste from University Health facilities based on current volumes. As waste volumes increase and exceed established thresholds and/or new locations are added, overage fees are then incurred and are thus estimated future costs. Transactional fees are estimated expenses for services that are non-routine and unpredictable. Examples of transactional fees have included mercury disposal, lead acid disposal, removal of waste oil/lubricants, pumping and flushing the Emergency Department contamination shower tanks, and pumping out of grease traps.

As compared to the previous contract amendment, this represents an approximately 16.9% increase in flat fee costs. Contributing factors to this increase include:

(1) Addition of a full sharps container exchange program (Waste Management incurs the cost of replacing the containers); (2) industrywide increases in landfill disposal fees (previously fixed at 2010 rates and absorbed by Waste Management); (3) addition of new service locations; and (4) estimated future overage fees for adding Women's & Children's Hospital. Once Women's & Children's Hospital opens and establishes operational history, Waste Management has agreed to renegotiate and include Women's & Children's in an updated flat fee schedule.

# **Strategic Note:**

This contract supports several aspects of Triple Aim Plus. Quality is achieved by minimizing waste exposures to staff and patients through staff education on proper handling and processing of all waste streams. Quality is also ensured by maintaining compliance with all regulatory bodies. Efficiencies are improved with ongoing analysis and evaluation of services to ensure University Health is minimizing costs and mitigating impacts to the environment.

# **December 2020 Financial Report**

In December, University Health operations continued to be significantly impacted by the COVID-19 crisis resulting in stay at home and social distancing directives reducing patient activity. Clinical activity (as measured by inpatient discharges) was down 6.0% for the month compared to budget. Community First Health Plans (CFHP) fully insured membership was up 14.8% to budget. On a consolidated basis, gain from operations was \$63.2 million, \$51.4 million better than budget. The consolidated bottom line gain (before financing activity) was \$54.4 million, \$47.4 million better than the budgeted gain of \$6.9 million. Higher supplemental, net patient and CFHP premium revenue slightly offset by higher operating expense resulted in performance better than budget. CFHP experienced a bottom line gain of \$5.4 million, which was \$2.2 million better than the budgeted gain of \$3.1 million. Higher premium revenue offset by premium deficiency reserve cost accounted for the improved performance to budget.

Notable increases or decreases from the December 31, 2019 Consolidated Balance Sheet (Monthly Financial Report page 2) are as follows:

- Cash, cash equivalents and long-term investments increased \$43.6 million due primarily to CFHP's positive performance and the transfer of the annual reserve rebalance to the board designated account.
- Other receivables and prepaid expenses decreased \$2.0 million due primarily to decreases in prepaid UHRIP IGT \$28.6 million offset by increases in supplemental revenue receivable \$13.8 million, premiums receivable \$7.3 million, prepaid expenses of \$5.4 million.
- Board designated accounts increased \$142.8 million due primarily to the annual reserve rebalance.

- Restricted accounts related to the bond proceeds and payments increased \$84.2 million due primarily to the issuance of Series 2020 Certificates of Obligation (COs) and collection of property tax for debt service offset by disbursements for construction costs.
- Net property, plant and equipment increased \$141.8 million as capitalized purchases exceeded depreciation expense. Capital assets placed in service increased \$146.2 million. Capital Improvement Project in progress increased \$67.0 million. Regular capital in progress decreased \$6.5 million, primarily the Epic project. Accumulated depreciation increased \$65.0 million.
- Accounts payable increased \$12.9 million primarily due to \$33.4 million decrease in amounts due for Medicaid Supplemental Liabilities and a \$46.4 million increase in amounts due to vendors.
- Long-term debt increased \$130.3 million due to the net of: refunding the Series 2010B COs; issuance of the Series 2020 Limited Refunding bonds; issuance of the Series 2020 COs; and the current principle payment due in 2021.
- University Health's Net Asset Value increased \$250 million on a Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) basis including debt service tax revenue, Build America Bonds (BABs) subsidy and interest expense on bonds.
- Financial performance for the year is subject to audit.

Significant items to note from the Monthly Consolidated Statement of Revenues and Expenses (Monthly Financial Report page 3) include the following:

• Net patient revenue of \$83.3 million in December was higher than budget by \$17.9 million primarily due to positive adjustments to prior year Medicare cost report liabilities. Year to date net patient revenue was down \$17.5 million due to lower activity related to COVID-19 disruptions.

- Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) patient revenue was up \$2.3 million from budget for the month. SNF operating expense, included in Purchased Services, was up \$1.0 million for the month.
- Other operating revenue was over budget \$40.5 million for December due to the CFHP premium revenue exceeding budget by \$9.5 million, UC revenue up \$9.1 million, NAIP revenue up \$7.3 million, DSH revenue up \$4.7 million, and DSRIP revenue up \$11.7 million. Year to date, other operating revenue was over budget \$166.0 million due to CFHP premium revenue up \$59.7 million, DSH revenue up \$25.2 million, recognition of \$18.4 million of CARES Act funds received in April and September, UC revenue up \$31.3 million, DSRIP revenue up \$23.9 million and SNF revenue up \$13.5 million.
- Employee compensation was over budget \$5.6 million or 9.5% for December and under budget \$18.3 million year to date. Salaries were over budget \$2.7 million for the month primarily due to the annual PTO accrual. Year to date salaries were under budget \$11.0 million year to date due primarily to lower Epic costs and patient activity due to COVID-19. Benefits were over budget \$2.8 million in December due primarily to higher employee health costs of \$5.6 million offset by lower retirement plan costs of \$3.0 million. Benefits were under budget year to date \$7.4 million due to lower retirement plan expense offset by higher employee health plan costs.
- Medical services were under budget \$5.8 million or 33.1% for the month due to reconciliation of the Medicaid supplemental services costs as the program winds down. Year to date medical services were under budget \$15.3 million due to lower Medicaid supplemental services and CareLink costs.
- Purchased services were over budget \$7.9 million or 31.0% for the month and \$3.0 million year to date. The monthly variance is related to higher CFHP admin costs of \$5.5 million and other purchased services cost for PDC of \$1.2 million. Year to date is over budget due to higher CFHP administrative costs of \$13.2 million, SNF costs of \$12.1 million, utilities \$3.1 million and equipment rental costs \$1.8 million offset by lower Epic costs of \$25.9 million.
- Supply costs were over budget \$3.7 million or 17.3% in December and under budget \$3.6 million year to date. The variance to budget is the result of higher medical supplies of \$3.1 million. Year to date pharmaceuticals were under budget \$11.3 million and implant costs were under \$9.5 million offset by medical supplies over budget \$18.5 million.

- Gain from operations in December of \$63.2 million was \$51.4 million above the budgeted gain of \$11.8 million.
- Investment income was under budget \$1.9 million in December due to lower interest rates.
- Unrealized loss on investments was \$136 thousand due to slightly rising interest rates in December.
- Gain before financing activity of \$54.4 million was \$47.4 million above the budgeted gain of \$6.9 million in December.

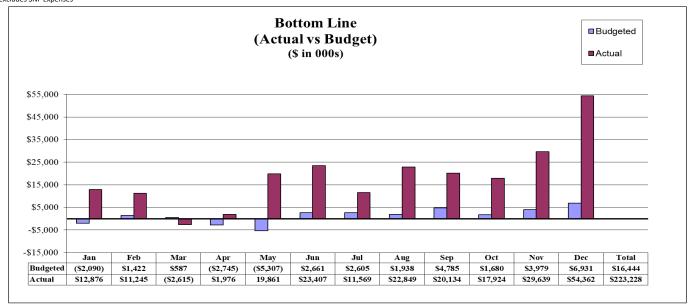

# **Quality Report**

The University Health Quality Report includes a review of quality metric performance with updates regarding initiatives to improve University Health's publicly reported quality data. This report details data from January-November 2020. The University Health quality metrics for 2020 include the following performance categories:

- Length of stay (LOS)
- Sepsis LOS
- Mortality
- Hospital readmissions
- PSI-90
- Patient safety composite
- Hospital-Acquired Infections (HAI)
- Sepsis bundle compliance (SEP-1)
- Cesarean section core measure (PC-02)
- Quality process composite

Metrics within these categories comprise a majority of items that are represented in the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade and data on hospitals that are publicly reported by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

# Length of Stay and Sepsis LOS

Length of stay for all inpatients is calculated as the ratio of observed length of stay (LOS) to expected LOS. Outcomes with an observed to expected ratio (O:E) less than 1.0 are performing better than expected and those greater than 1.0 are performing worse than expected. Our goal for 2020 for all inpatient length of stay is a ratio of 0.81 as compared to 2019 baseline performance of 0.85. This metric is currently at a value of 0.85. Our goal for 2020 for sepsis length of stay is 13.33 days as compared to 2019 baseline performance of 14.54 days. This metric is currently at a value of 16.78 days. Both of these metrics were negatively impacted by the

extended length of stay observed among COVID-19 positive inpatients admitted to University Hospital during the second and third quarter.

# **Mortality**

Mortality is calculated as an observed to expected ratio based on national data for patient diagnoses and severity of illness. Our goal for 2020 for mortality is a ratio of 0.66 as compared to 2019 baseline performance of 0.67. This metric is currently at a value of 0.77. Although increased from baseline, this mortality ratio continues to rank well compared to national benchmarks. This metric was negatively impacted by the COVID-19 positive inpatients admitted during the second and third quarter. Despite this effect, the mortality observed to expected ratio has decreased from its peak value in July during the past three months. Our primary strategy to improve this metric lies with efforts to continue to improve clinical documentation to properly reflect the severity of illness of inpatients, the use of other appropriate healthcare settings such as hospice, and an increased focus on improving outcomes of patients with sepsis.

# **Hospital Readmissions**

Hospital readmissions are measured as an observed to expected ratio of readmissions to the hospital within 30 days of the initial admission for the eight readmission diagnoses incorporated into the CMS Readmission Reduction Program including the following: all acute-care patients (ACA); acute myocardial infarction (AMI); congestive heart failure (CHF); chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD); pneumonia (PNE); stroke; coronary artery bypass graft surgery (CABG); and hip and knee joint replacement surgery (THA/TKA).

Our goal for 2020 for hospital readmissions is a ratio of 0.84 as compared to 2019 baseline performance of 0.98. This metric is currently at a value of 0.97. Improvements have been made as a result of using patient navigators to conduct focused patient and family education, scheduling follow-up appointments, post-acute care follow-up calls, and dedicated handoffs to ambulatory patient navigators. These efforts improve the patient experience and help ensure more effective transitions of care.

# **University Health Patient Safety Composite and PSI-90**

The University Health patient safety composite metric was revised in 2020 to reflect an increased focus on specific components of the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Score and the Patient Safety Indicator (PSI) metric (PSI-90), which also impacts the CMS Hospital Star Rating program. PSIs are specific, hospital-acquired patient outcomes used to measure safety. PSI-90 is a calculated, risk-adjusted observed to expected ratio determined from clinical documentation coding and is composed of ten separate metrics to include the following:

- Pressure Ulcer Per 1000 Inpatients
- Iatrogenic Pneumothorax Per 1000 Inpatients
- In Hospital Fall with Hip Fracture Per 1000 Inpatients
- Perioperative Hemorrhage or Hematoma Per 1000 Inpatients
- Postoperative Acute Kidney Injury Requiring Dialysis Per 1000 Inpatients
- Postoperative Respiratory Failure Per 1000 Inpatients
- Perioperative Pulmonary Embolism or DVT Per 1000 Inpatients
- Postoperative Sepsis Per 1000 Inpatients
- Postoperative Wound Dehiscence Per 1000 Inpatients
- Accidental Puncture or Laceration Per 1000 Inpatients

Our goal for 2020 for the PSI-90 metric is a ratio of 0.70 as compared to 2019 baseline performance of 0.84. This metric is currently at a value of 0.66. This is better than goal at 105% to target and represents a significant improvement over baseline.

In addition to PSI-90 performance, University Health is focused on six additional PSI metrics in University Health's Patient Safety Composite for 2020 including:

- Pressure Ulcer (PSI-3)
- Perioperative Hemorrhage or Hematoma (PSI-9)
- Postoperative Respiratory Failure (PSI-11)
- Perioperative Pulmonary Embolism or DVT (PSI-12)
- Postoperative Sepsis (PSI-13)
- Accidental Puncture or Laceration (PSI-15)

To date, all six metrics are better than 2019 baseline performance targeted goals and three (PSI-9, PSI-11 and PSI-15) are significantly better than targeted goals. Although opportunity remains with PSI-3, we have seen a marked improvement in performance September through November 2020 with zero events in November (lower is better). This is a result of a focused effort to engage nursing leadership and physician champions to improve the assessment, documentation, and performance

regarding the prevention of pressure ulcers in order to reduce these adverse outcomes.

# **Hospital-Acquired Infections Composite**

University Health's Hospital-Acquired Infections (HAIs) Composite metric includes the following:

- Central Line Associated Blood Stream Infections (CLABSI)
- Catheter Associated Urinary Tract Infections (CAUTI)
- Methicillin-Resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* bloodstream infection (MRSA)
- Hospital-Acquired *Clostridioides difficile* colitis (CDI)
- Deep and organ-space Surgical site infections (SSI) for colon and hysterectomy surgical patients

Performance for these indicators is measured as a Standardized Infection Ratio (SIR) benchmarked against national data and as a rate per patient day, per device day, or per procedure. Performance during 2019 for all HAIs was substantially better than national benchmarks in all categories of infections. To date in 2020, performance for all HAI metrics for 2020 is at 72% of target and worse than 2019 baseline with the exception of CDI and SSIs for colon surgical patients, both of which are better than the 2019 baseline.

In particular, there was a reduction in performance during the second quarter with device-associated infections (CAUTI and CLABSI) among the COVID-19 patient population. This appears to be due, in part, to clinical challenges associated with caring for patients in higher levels of isolation with a higher frequency of device utilization. We also saw a declination in performance for preventing MRSA infections and SSIs for hysterectomy surgical patients. The trend for all HAI metrics improved in September through November 2020.

The reversal of the negative trend validates our efforts to address the unfavorable performance in July and August 2020. These actions include the partnership between nursing and infection prevention leaders who identified opportunities for improvement. We have also successfully addressed several initial challenges posed by the July implementation of the new Epic electronic health record including changes in workflow that negatively impacted the performance of daily HAI prevention care bundles and prompt removal of devices such as central lines and

urinary catheters.

In September 2020, we also began a new initiative designed to engage the inpatient medical directors as key drivers of HAI prevention bundle compliance through weekly multi-disciplinary leadership rounding with infection control, senior medical and nursing leadership, and unit nursing directors. We continue to highlight University Health's Achieving Zero program and annual awards, which identify the inpatient nursing units that prevent one or more hospital acquired infections for one or more years.

# **Quality Processes Composite**

Three CMS-defined patient core measures comprise the University Health process composite metric, which include:

- Venous thromboembolism prophylaxis (VTE-6)
- Influenza vaccination (IMM-2)
- Early elective delivery (PC-01).

Performance to date is excellent for these metrics and is significantly better than 2019 baseline and well beyond target goal performance (133% to target).

#### **Cesarean Section Rate**

The Cesarean section rate core measure (PC-02) examines the rate of nulliparous women with a term, singleton baby in a vertex position delivered by cesarean birth. Our 2020 goal for this core measure is 23%. The current value is 26%, better than 2019 baseline performance of 29%. Improvement in this metric has been supported by the review of all cases in this category with the medical director of Obstetrics in order to identify opportunities for clinical documentation improvement or refinement of the clinical selection of patients for Cesarean section.

# **Sepsis Bundle Compliance**

The sepsis bundle compliance (SEP-1) is measured by the review of a random sample population of adult patients 18 years and older with a final coded diagnosis of severe sepsis or septic shock. The first three clinical interventions must occur and be documented within 3 hours of severe sepsis onset, while the remaining interventions must occur and be documented within 6 hours of septic shock onset.

Our goal for 2020 for the sepsis bundle compliance is 54% as compared to 2019 baseline performance of 38%. This metric is currently at a value of 50.5%. University Health has placed increased focus on improving this metric with the use of key performance indicators, the development of nurse driven protocols to accelerate care, greater collaboration between staff and UT Health providers, and the implementation of Epic tools to monitor and manage patients with early sepsis.

#### **Survey on Patient Safety Culture:**

University Health regularly surveys staff utilizing a tool built by Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) to assess staff and provider perceptions regarding patient safety. In November 2020, this survey was sent to all University Health staff, including providers with University Medicine Associates and UT Health San Antonio. Performing this survey helps the Health System leadership to highlight successes and identify opportunities for improving care and patient safety. Analysis of these data is underway and will help inform our strategic planning for the coming year.

## **University Health COVID-19 Update**

#### **Background:**

As most people in the world are now acutely aware, an outbreak of COVID-19 was detected in mainland China in December of 2019. As of this writing, every continent in the world has been affected by this highly contagious disease, with nearly 100 million cases diagnosed in over 200 countries worldwide. The cause of this outbreak is a new virus, known as the severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2).

On February 12, 2020, WHO officially named the disease caused by the novel coronavirus as Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). Coronaviruses are a family of viruses that can cause mild to moderate upper-respiratory illnesses such as the common cold, severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) and Middle East respiratory syndrome (MERS).

In total, Bexar County has seen over 148,000 confirmed cases patients and over 2,000 deaths affected by the COVID-19 virus. Since February 2020, University Health has continued to make adjustments and adapt to the patient care needs within the community. Starting with being one of the first healthcare organizations in the county to do and support other hospitals with COVID-19 testing and the administration of 2,000 vaccinations a day as of January 2021. The past year has been one that defined University Health's commitment to the community and how a public hospital system can be a leader in the community for all its citizens.

# **Community COVID-19 Testing:**

University Health worked in collaboration with the Regional Medical Operations Center to help establish early COVID-19 testing for the community. On May 4, 2020, University Health transitioned support of operations at the Joe Freeman

Coliseum in order to redeploy staff to provide in-house testing capabilities. As of January 19, 2021, University Health has received and processed a cumulative total of 102,465 COVID-19 diagnostic tests.

#### **Inpatient Capacity Management:**

University Health has continuously been monitoring COVID-19 trends in the region. Inpatient COVID-19 admissions began significantly increasing in mid-November, 2020. In response to this increase, University Hospital enacted a phased response plan to ensure appropriate bed availability for services. This included:

- On November 19th, University Hospital began converting inpatient rehabilitation beds into medicine beds. University Hospital worked with outside rehabilitation hospitals to appropriately place patients in need of inpatient rehabilitation services. Inpatients on the rehabilitation unit continued their plan of care until discharge. This allowed University Hospital to add up to 27 additional medicine inpatient beds for patient surge.
- On November, 30th, four additional medicine beds were added in 9th floor Rio Tower.
- On December 3rd, additional COVID-19 ICU beds were created on 8th Floor Sky Tower as a backup to 5th floor ICU.
- On December 17th, Sky Tower third floor Pre-Op patients were relocated to the newly opened Advanced Diagnostic Center in order to continue to perform surgical procedures. This opened the third floor Pre-Op area for up to 21 additional medicine inpatients.
- On January 11th, 2021, the Advanced Diagnostic Center was converted into an inpatient medicine unit to care for up to 30 inpatients if needed.
- In addition, the Emergency Department has created new locations and surge protocols to appropriately care for additional surge increases in the area.

# **Surgical Management:**

On January 4th, 2021, University Hospital paused scheduling of any additional

elective operations that required a postoperative inpatient stay, this did not apply to either of the offsite surgery centers. This pause also did not apply to CMS Tier 3a or 3b procedures. Examples of Tier 3 procedures could include trauma, transplants, cardiac surgery, cancer, or neurosurgery procedures. However, due to the continued rise in COVID-19 admissions, it became clear that on January 11th, 2021, the only procedures scheduled at University Hospital were those meeting 3a or 3b criteria. Daily monitoring between UT Health San Antonio and University Health leadership provides physician and nursing collaboration to quickly pivot operations to minimize community impact. University Hospital limited visitors in alignment with all other Bexar County Hospitals.

#### **UMA COVID-19 Response:**

As of January 2021, UMA is closely working with the Epic Ambulatory team to evaluate workflows to be able to integrate telemedicine within the MyChart Application. This integration will allow for the expansion of telemedicine capabilities throughout UMA primary care and specialty providers.

The peak utilization of telehealth within UMA was during April 2020, where 82.15% of patients were seen via telehealth and 17.25% of patients were seen through face to face encounters. The total UMA encounters for 2020 were 409,096 and of that total 152,297 were telehealth encounters which represented 37.23% of the volume for the year.

# **Procurement:**

As the COVID-19 pandemic developed, the traditional supply chain was interrupted as demand far exceeded supply and prime distributers were no longer able to support a just-in-time methodology. Initially, University Health was expecting extremely limited days of critical PPE; however, the Supply Chain team developed alternate sourcing methods for PPE while building an emergency stock.

The Robert B Green Annex building (old San Antonio School District warehouse) was converted using industrial shelving and designed to permanently house a rotating stock of PPE. Reporting to the COVID-19 taskforce on a daily basis during peak months of COVID-19 planning, University Health's days of supply for N95 masks went from as low as a three days to currently over 945 days at the current utilization rate. The isolation gown stock has grown to an 87 day supply and includes

the use of reusable gowns to minimize the utilization rate of disposable gowns. Additionally, the development of a PPE dashboard has provided a real-time view of inventory for over 80 critical supply items to senior leadership, and broadening vendor distribution channels has provided the ability to further grow as supply needs change for University Health's caregivers.

#### **Pharmacy Operations and Support:**

The Pharmacy Department at University Health has become a leader in the Bexar County community for providing optimum pharmaceutical care. Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Pharmacy Department has worked diligently with local and state officials to "think outside the box" to meet the needs and demand of patient care. When the state's initial efforts to test stalled due to lack of viral transport media, University Health pharmacy created a process to manufactured tens of thousands of these products so that testing could continue.

When the initial COVID-19 treatment therapies were in the early testing phases, University Health Pharmacy Department supported four studies, with over 250 patients, one of which was the largest in the world. Through the collaborative effort between the Pharmacy Department and the Antimicrobial Stewardship Team, the development and continued modification of all COVID-19 treatment protocols for hospitalized patients has helped clinicians provide the most up to date and successful treatments available to help fight this pandemic.

Due to the volume surge of admitted patients, the Pharmacy Department recognized an opportunity to minimize the frequency of direct contact with COVID-19 positive patients in order to preserve the amount of PPE, but still allow clinicians the ability to deliver safe and exceptional care. In order for this process improvement to be successful the pharmacy team re-wrote the entire medication administration time protocols to combine treatment doses. Additionally, as volume surged in the Emergency Department, a pharmacist was dedicated 24/7 to support therapeutic efforts to ensure quality and timely patient care.

University Health has been able to successfully navigate through approximately 141 critical drug shortages, and provide alternatives to ensure therapeutic treatment consistency, including the development of Code Blue Medication Packs to meet increased demands for Advanced Life Support Medications. Recently, the FDA granted Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for monoclonal antibodies whose

administration was meant to prevent mild symptoms from becoming severe enough to require hospitalization. These products have to be manufactured in a sterile environment, and University Health offered to collect the allocations given to each hospital in the county, making 100 products per day for the Regional Infusion Center located at the Freeman Coliseum.

#### **Employee and Community Vaccination Volume:**

The COVID-19 vaccine administration is a collaborative effort that requires complex storage, handling and manipulation. In order to maximize safety, accuracy and patient throughput, University Health Pharmacy along with a strong Information Systems support developed an operational plan to provide all vaccine administrators in a ready-to-use bar code labeled syringe. As of Monday, January 18, 2021, University Health has administered 35,431 doses of Moderna and Pfizer vaccine. These have been distributed among staff, first responders, frontline health care workers outside University Health, teachers and members of the public who are in the 1B category of 65+ or with chronic health conditions.

It was recognized early that University Health was going to be a significant vaccination recipient and leadership worked together to develop a community vaccination plan which included online and telephonic registration for 1B qualified persons in our community. The Wonderland Mall was chosen as the site and their owners supported this enthusiastically. In a matter of days, the site was prepared from IT, clinical staff and operations. In the first day close to 1,500 doses were given to community. Expectations are to open a larger site in Wonderland mall in February to accommodate 5,000 daily vaccinations. While the community site was up and operational, the Robert B. Green Campus expanded services to support other front line organizations such as CommuniCare, CentroMed, CHCS, Food Bank and many others.

#### **Community Collaboration:**

On 4 January 2021, University Health began providing COVID-19 vaccine to members of the community eligible to receive the vaccine in Phase 1B at Wonderland Mall. The San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (Metro Health) and WellMed subsequently developed plans to offer COVID-19 vaccine at additional community locations including the Alamodome, the Elvira Cisneros Senior Community Activity Center, and the Alicia Trevino Lopez Senior One-Stop Center.

Due to the limited availability of COVID-19 vaccine, University Health partnered with these organizations to share vaccine supply in order to enable all four community-based vaccination locations to operate by 11 January 2021. Given the restrictions to current COVID-19 vaccine supply as provided by the federal and state governments, University Health is working with Metro Health, STRAC, WellMed, and UT Health San Antonio on a frequent basis in order to load balance weekly vaccine allotments to sustain the multiple-site community-based mass vaccination model.

University Hospital continues to receive all adult and pediatric trauma patients transported by EMS directly from the locations where people are injured. Through our military-civilian partnership, we made a request for Brooke Army Medical Center (BAMC) to temporarily receive all adult trauma transfers from other hospitals in the region. University Health will continue to receive all pediatric trauma and pediatric burn transfers, similar to operations during the summer COVID-19 surge.

The Level I Trauma Centers at University Hospital and BAMC normally split these transfers evenly. University Health is grateful for the leadership at BAMC who readily assumed the additional influx of civilian patients. This allows for load-balancing to optimize the regional COVID-19 surge response, while also maintaining high quality trauma care and access, which is the norm in South Texas. Additionally, BAMC is voluntarily serving as a regional resource for critically ill COVID-19 patients requiring ECMO. The great civilian-military trauma partnership between University Health, UT Health San Antonio, and BAMC has improved both COVID-19 care and trauma care.

## Collaborative efforts between University Health and UT Health San Antonio:

In October 2020, the University Health Vaccine Program Implementation Group organized internal efforts in anticipation of the forthcoming COVID-19 vaccines. This group began to address areas outlined in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) COVID-19 Vaccination Program Interim Playbook for Jurisdictional Operations and the Texas COVID-19 Vaccination Plan including: organizational structure; phased allocation tiers for priority populations and University Health staff; enrollment of University Hospital, University Health ambulatory locations, and University Health pharmacies to serve as COVID-19 vaccine provider sites; allocation, ordering, distribution, and inventory

management; storage and handling; administration, documentation, and reporting; immunization information systems; vaccine program communication; regulatory considerations; and vaccine safety monitoring. UT Health San Antonio launched their COVID-19 Vaccine Assessment and Access Task Force in November 2020, including University Health representatives to coordinate planning efforts, specifically around tiered allocation groups and vaccine distribution. COVID-19 immunization of University Health staff and providers eligible to receive the vaccine in Phase 1A began on 18 December 2020.

#### **Strategic Note:**

As the COVID-19 vaccine distribution continues to expand to two locations at Wonderland Mall for University Health, the expansion of vaccines provided by Metro Health and Wellmed, will hopefully continue to decrease the impact of COVID-19 in our community. University Health continues to work with the STRAC region officials and Texas state officials to learn, improve, and implement additional vaccine distribution that have been overwhelmingly positively received by the community.

Report on the 87th Texas Legislative Session

# **Background:**

The 87th Texas Legislature convened on Tuesday, January 12, 2021, for its 140-day biennial regular session, and is scheduled to adjourn May 31, 2021. In those 140 days, lawmakers need to pass a balanced budget to govern state revenue collection and spending over the 2022-23 biennium, a congressional and legislative redistricting bill, and take care of any state agencies scheduled to "sunset" before the start of the next session. The issues facing the Legislature, such as grappling with projected shortfalls to the state budget and redrawing the state's political maps, are expected to be particularly challenging since lawmakers will have to accomplish these tasks during a public health crisis.

The first order of business in the Texas House was to elect a new Speaker of the House. State Representative Dade Phelan (R-Beaumont) was elected the new Speaker, the third new speaker in as many sessions. The House voted 143-2 for Phelan, with four members not voting. Speaker Phelan has served in the Texas House since 2015 and has served as Chairman of the House Committee on State Affairs and previously served on the Natural Resources Committee as Vice-Chair, Calendars Committee, Appropriations Committee, and Elections Committee. As he addressed members for the first time as speaker Tuesday, Speaker Phelan acknowledged the tough agenda and outlined a few of the chamber's priorities, including, telemedicine, encouraging the House to make permanent many of the changes in regulations waived by the governor during the pandemic.

This session, the Bexar County Legislative Delegation has two changes Sen. Roland Gutierrez goes from the House to the Senate to represent Senate District 19, and Rep. Liz Campos was elected to represent House District 119, Sen. Gutierrez's old House district.

#### **Budget Issues:**

On January 11, 2021, in accordance with Article III, Section 49a of the Texas Constitution, Comptroller Glenn Hegar released his **biennial revenue estimate** (see attached infographic) informing the incoming legislature how much state revenue would be available for the remainder of fiscal 2021 and the upcoming 2022-23 biennium. Highlights of his estimates include:

- **General Revenue** For 2022-23, the state can expect to have \$112.53 billion in funds available for general-purpose spending compared to \$112.96 from the last biennium. That represents a <u>0.4 percent decrease</u> from the corresponding amount of funds available for the 2020-21 biennium.
- **Total Revenue** State revenue from all sources and for all purposes is expected to reach \$270.5 billion for the 2022-23 biennium, including about \$98.2 billion in federal receipts; as well as \$52.7 billion in other revenues dedicated for specific purposes and therefore unavailable for general-purpose spending.
- Economic Stabilization Fund (ESF) The ESF (the state's "Rainy Day Fund") currently contains about \$10.5 billion, not counting currently outstanding spending authority; Absent any legislative appropriations, the ESF balance is expected to total \$11.6 billion at the end of 2022-23;

But before policymakers finally decide on the 2022-23 state budget, they will need to pass a supplemental appropriations bill shoring up unfinanced state obligations in the current biennial budget originally crafted by lawmakers in 2019. The ending 2021 budget balance will be close to a negative \$1 billion (\$946 million). In his report to the legislature the Comptroller stated, "The projected negative ending balance in 2020-21 is a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which caused revenue collections to fall well short of what was expected when the 86th Legislature approved the 2020-21 budget."

# University Health Legislative App – uhslegislative.com

In 2015, University Health created a web-based app to share its legislative priorities with members of the legislature, Board Members, staff and the public. This tool allows staff to provide members with real time information regarding issues of importance and allows us to do so in an environmental responsible way. This tool is even more important this session, as many offices are closed and operating virtually. Bottom-line, University Health is uniquely well positioned to effective communicate our agenda with members of the legislature. On this easy-to-use responsive website,

members will find policy positions, contact information, and background information. During the session, as information on legislation changes, the site will be updated to reflect real-time changes and additional information will be added to each issue as needed.

# Report on Recent Recognitions and Upcoming Events

This recognition includes, adult lung, adult and pediatric liver (living and deceased), and adult and pediatric kidney (living and deceased) transplantation. This recognition demonstrates the transplant team's expertise in providing high quality specialized care, as well as outcomes for transplant patients among the best in the country. Additionally, the deceased donor and living donor adult liver transplant programs were recognized for their costefficiency as well as quality.
- Aetna has recertified University Health as a member of its Institutes of Excellence (IOE) network for Pediatric Congenital Heart Services. Each year, Aetna reviews quality and outcomes data for these programs to ensure they are only preauthorizing care for their members at centers that maintain a strong commitment to providing outstanding care for babies and children with serious heart conditions.
- University Hospital nurse and house supervisor Missam "Sam" Merchant was honored as a "Weezie Angel" by the Louise H. Batz Patient Safety

Foundation. Sam was recognized for his commitment to staff and patient safety during the COVID-19 pandemic. As the Foundation stated, "Sam is a strong leader who is willing to ask the tough questions and has a passion to improve care from the root of the issue."

# Update on the Women's and Children's Hospital and Associated Projects

#### **Background:**

The architectural and engineering (A/E) team of Marmon Mok Architecture, L.L.P. (a.k.a. Marmon Mok/ZGF) was selected by University Health System (University Health) for the design and planning services for the Women's and Children's Hospital and Associated Projects (Project). The A/E team was authorized and engaged in March 2018 to provide the first phase (Phase I) of design and planning services for the Project. Phase I included master planning, program validation, scope alignment, site investigations, and budget development. In July 2018, the A/E team commenced full architectural and engineering design services for the Project.

The Project's initial design phase is complete and the final Construction Documents (CDs) for the Garage and the Women's and Children's Hospital were delivered for permit review in mid-August, including floors 8-11 that accommodate the inpatient programs identified in the Blue Cottage Clinical Space Program and 12<sup>th</sup> floor Core and Shell and Podium Expansion Core and Shell spaces. Permitting is also complete. In June 2020, the Board authorized additional design funding to add design scope including the build out of floor 12 for an additional thirty (30) private inpatient rooms, and the Kitchen, Servery, Dining Room, and Conference Rooms in the Podium expansion. These design packages are expected in spring and summer 2021.

The Construction Manager (Joeris + JE Dunn, a Joint Venture) commenced work on site in June 2019 for the Advanced Diagnostic Center (formerly the Heart/Vascular & Endoscopy Center) and started other enabling projects in August 2019. Work on the Women's and Children's Hospital and the new garage commenced in early 2020. The Underground Utility Reroute and North Garage Demolition are complete. The Advanced Diagnostic Center is complete and fully operational. The hospital and garage are projected to be complete in mid-2023.

#### **Analysis:**

Construction of the Advanced Diagnostic Center is complete except for architectural punch list items. Final inspections, commissioning and activation began in late November and enabled a rolling opening for patient care in mid-December 2020. Work on the Women's and Children's Hospital continues with below grade work and concrete placement. Concrete columns and grade preparations progressed sufficiently to enable concrete slab work to begin in late-December. Vertical construction begins in early 2021.

The Construction Manager is coordinating with the A/E team to refine construction cost estimates for remaining portions of the work not yet issued. The final Guaranteed Maximum Price package (GMP #13) is projected to be presented in February or March 2021 and will include interior finishes, specialty construction, interior glazing, landscaping and final sitework, signage, traffic and pavement markings, and miscellaneous support work.

The A/E team continues with preliminary design planning for the additional patient rooms on the 12<sup>th</sup> floor, and the future support services (kitchen, servery, dining, etc.) that will move to the Podium expansion. This planning includes coordination with the Construction Manager's schedule to ensure continuity of efficient construction progress. Ensuring that the design deliverables are available before permanent construction of lower level structural and utility elements will preserve the ability for University Health to incorporate this potential additional scope at best cost and without undue impact to the overall completion schedule.

In November 2020, the Board approved an increase to Project funding of \$86 million for soft costs including medical equipment (MEQ), active IT, and fixtures, furnishings, and equipment (FFE). This amount included \$5.63 million for the BioMed Buildout Associated Project. The current approved Project budget as of November 30, 2020 is \$777.6 million and is summarized in Attachment "A".

# **Progress Update:**

- a) Advanced Diagnostic Center (formerly Heart/Vascular & Endoscopy Center)
  - Procurement, deployment and installation of medical equipment, furniture, and active IT equipment has been completed.

- Construction, artwork installations, final inspections, city inspections and architectural punch list inspections have been completed. Certificate of occupancy by the City of San Antonio has been received. Report from the Final state inspection held December 3, 2020 has been received and all corrections completed.
- Terminal cleaning of procedure rooms, stocking of medical supplies and training of staff personnel on use of new medical equipment has been completed.
- Coordination for space activation and occupancy is complete.
- ADC is occupied and fully operational as of January 25, 2021.

#### b) Women's & Children's Hospital

- Completed work includes drilled piers, utility tie-ins to the existing plant, underground utility work, elevator pit construction and pier cap placement.
- Concrete is being placed for basement floor and columns in preparation for placing concrete for upper-level floors.
- CPS Energy (electrical supply) transformers infrastructure is being installed that includes duct bank work across Merton Minter.
- Building envelope (curtain walls, windows, metal panels, etc.) mockup for lab testing is still under construction. Testing is scheduled in early February 2021.

## c) Garage

- Installation of underground utilities, additional under slab drainage features to collect and remove excess groundwater, and pier caps are complete.
- Structural concrete columns and grade preparations for slab on grade and upper-level concrete pours are in progress.
- Slab on grade concrete pours began in December 2020 and continue into February 2021.

# d) Podium Expansion

• Focused user group meetings to inform Schematic Design of the Phase 1 Buildout (Kitchen, Servery, Conference Rooms) were conducted in November and December 2020.

- Discussions regarding University Health vision for franchise/branded food service concepts in the Servery are ongoing.
- Schematic Design is anticipated by March 2021, followed by Design Development in summer 2021 and Construction Documents in fall 2021.
- e) BioMed Buildout
  - Construction kick off meeting (Structure Only) held on January 15, 2021
