

Before Participating in a Clinical Trial

Questions to Ask Your Doctor

- 1. What is the purpose of the study?
- 2. Why do researchers believe the new treatment being tested may be effective? Has it been tested before?
- 3. What is the researcher's reason for doing the trial? Is he/she receiving payment for each research subject's participation?
- 4. How long will the trial last?
- 5. Where will information from the study go?
- 6. What other options or choices do I have if I decide not to participate?
- 7. What is likely to happen to me with or without this treatment?
- 8. What tests and treatments does the study involve? Will I be hospitalized?
- 9. What are the short-term and long-term risks and benefits of this trial? What are the possible side effects? How do these compare to my current treatments?
- 10. How will the trial affect my daily life?
- 11. Could my condition become worse during the study? What will happen if it does?
- 12. If I am harmed as a result of the research, what treatment would I receive?
- 13. What do you do to monitor patient safety throughout the trial?
- 14. What type of long-term follow up care is part of the study?
- 15. Who will pay for the treatment and all other expenses related to the study?
- 16. How can I end my participation in the study if I change my mind?
- 17. Whom do I contact for questions and information about the study?
