

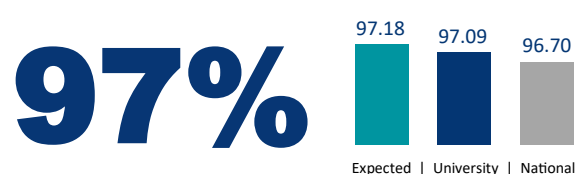
PROGRAM STATISTICS

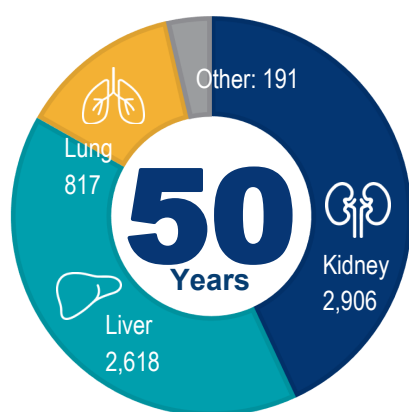

Where to Find Program Information

Visit www.srtr.org to perform your search. See how long patients wait for an organ transplant and how well patients do after transplant surgery. You can look up information for every transplant center across the United States. University Transplant Institute currently meets regulatory requirements by CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) and UNOS (United Network of Organ Sharing).

- #1** At the very top of the homepage (next to the logo), locate the drop-down menu called **Find & Compare Transplant Programs**.

- #2** Select your search criteria. For example: you may want to look up information on liver transplants at University Health.
