### History of Trauma-Informed Care Awareness Month

**Trauma-Informed Care** began as a patient care approach that focused on the traumatizing toll that war took on veterans in the 1970s. The affects that many veterans faced allowed researchers and medical professionals to understand how trauma can have a lasting impact on the body and mind. In the 1980s, the National Institute of Mental Health was able to coin the term *Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder* or *PTSD*. This then led Ronald Reagan, in 1988, to recognize the need for trauma awareness and established May as Trauma Awareness Month.

As time progressed, the understanding of trauma and the effects it has on the mind expanded outside of the war, and into civilian life. The question then posed was how individuals who faced other traumas, such as abuse and neglect at key developmental years, compare to those who faced traumas well into adulthood.

In the 1990s, Dr. Robert Anda and Dr. Vincent Felitti conducted the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study, which answered how these experiences can have an overall and long-lasting impact on an individual from childhood and into adulthood. Their work is essential to reducing adverse childhood experiences and building resilient communities.

Over the next few years, various organizations, including the International Society for Traumatic Stress and the National Center for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, were created. In the1990s, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) expanded the conversation of trauma and shed light on how abuse can affect individuals from an early age and how re-traumatization can occur years after the initial incident. By 2000, SAMHSA and the U.S. Congress established the National Child Traumatic Stress Initiative and the National Child Stress Network.

Though the concept of Trauma-Informed Care has evolved over the last 50 years, it has gained increased traction and has become an institution for many. Still, there is much work to be done in raising awareness, becoming conscientious of others' experiences, and becoming more empathetic towards one another.

### The Institute for Trauma-Informed Care

In January 2020, University Health partnered with the City of San Antonio to establish the Institute for Trauma-Informed Care (The Institute). The partnership would be the inception of a five-year plan to transform San Antonio and Bexar County into a trauma-informed community.

The Institute would become the training and technical assistance entity for organizations wishing to become certified in Trauma-Informed Care (TIC).

### **Key Functions and Services**

- Partner with the Consortium to align TIC efforts in San Antonio by promoting a community vision, shared definition and common language.
- Ensure San Antonio's approach to delivering TIC reflects the community's unique culture and demographic characteristics.
- Provide cross-sector education and training on trauma and TIC to promote increased awareness and drive a citywide culture change.
- Promote the use of trauma-informed best practices, across a variety of community sectors, that align with the community's needs.
- Provide assessment, training, technical assistance and coaching to organizations that want to become trauma-informed.

In 2021, the Institute for Trauma-Informed Care developed a month-long calendar to bring awareness to Trauma-Informed Care. This year, we have expanded the calendar in scope, and we hope you find the events informative and enlightening in your journey to becoming traumainformed.





### **Trauma-Informed Care Initiative**

#### The South Texas Trauma-Informed Care Consortium


(Consortium) was formed between The Children's Shelter, Voices for Children and City of San Antonio Metro Health Department; the three Founding members of the Collaboration. The Consortium brings together organizations and participants that are committed to addressing the impact of trauma. The STTICC goals are:

- To educate the community about trauma, the impact of trauma and re-traumatization, and how widespread trauma-related impact can be;
- To raise awareness of the importance of being trauma informed;
- To build a resilient community and mitigate the effects of trauma related impact.

The mission of the Consortium is to communicate the "why." It informs the development and implementation of the system. The Consortium acts as the project's ambassador, advisor, and community liaison. The Consortium was joined in 2020 by two crucial pieces of the bedrock of resiliency-building in South Texas; The Institute for Trauma Informed Care, and The Certifying Entity.


The Institute for Trauma Informed Care is responsible for the "what" of the system. In October 2019, the City of San Antonio selected University Health to provide trauma-informed training and technical assistance to other health care organizations for the Trauma-Informed San Antonio project. University Health established the Institute for Trauma-Informed Care in January of 2020. The Institute provides training, technical assistance and coaching opportunities to organizations that want to become certified in Trauma-Informed Care (TIC). The Institute's efforts are tailored to the culture and unique health needs of San Antonio.

The Certifying Entity determines the "who" in achieving status as certified to deliver trauma informed care. The Consortium selected the Ecumenical Center as the trauma-informed certifying entity in 2019. The next year, the Center for Trauma-Informed Certification was launched as the first entity to provide trauma-informed certification for organizations in Texas, one of first in the nation.





# **Training Menu**

#### Introduction to Trauma Informed Care (1 Hr)

This course serves as an overview of critical elements to help build a foundation of traumainformed care. This session includes an introduction to Adverse Childhood Experiences, the impact of trauma and trauma-informed care and highlights how the Institute can help organizations on their journey towards trauma-informed certification.

#### Implementing Trauma Informed Care Principles (1 Hr)

This course serves as an overview of the impact of trauma and an introduction to the six key principles of a trauma-informed approach. The information in this course will serve as building blocks to help you on your trauma-informed journey.
